Getting Electricity

Further reduce time to get connected to the grid by deploying online systems

Ensure compliance to revised procedures and timelines for getting connected to the grid

Getting Credit

Improve access to credit by driving usage of the National Collateral Registry

Facilitate the usage of credit bureaus for the provision of credit data and credit scoring

Expected Results

- Reduce time for getting electricity by 10 days
- Notice based system for works that involve crossing of road

Paying Taxes

Simplify the process and reduce the time for paying taxes

Expected Results

- All large and medium size enterprises to be registered on e-filing system
- Reduce average time for filing and paying taxes by 50%

Trading Across Borders

Enable quicker and easier movement of goods across borders

Expected Results

- Joint examination of import cargo in Lagos (led by NCS) and prevent multiple inspections
- Compliance with 48-hour SLA for automated scheduling process by pre-shipment inspection agents
- Compliance with 24-hour SLA for processing of Net Export Proceeds (NXP) Form
- Compliance with reduced documentation for exports (7 documents) and imports (8 documents)

Simplify the government procurement process for SMEs

Expected Results

- Clear guidelines and documentation for selling to the government (applicable to SMEs)
- BPP to ensure compliance of relevant government agencies to laid down procedures and timelines

Entry and Exit of People

Improve the experience of travelers entering and leaving Nigeria

- Decrease time spent at the airports
- Streamline processes for entering the country

Expected Results

- Single Passenger Clearance system at airports to reduce average clearance time by 50%
- Processing and approval of Temporary Work Permit (TWP) within 48 hours
- Automated Expatriate Quota (EQ) application process at the Federal Ministry of Interior (FMI)

Trading Within Nigeria

Simplify the process of registering food and drugs at NAFDAC

- Clarify required documentation and procedures
- Define timelines for registration

Enforce removal of illegal roadblocks

Trademark registry to clear backlog of outstanding marks

Expected Results

- 90-day processing timeline for registration of food and drugs in Nigeria
- Clearly defined fees and processes for registering a product with NAFDAC to be published online



NAFDAC

- Published list of all approved checkpoints, available online and disseminated in local media
- Elimination of illegal roadblocks on major trading routes in the country
